- Buildings and uses aligned with Comp Plan vision
- Compact, pedestrian-oriented
- Complementary uses to serve community needs
- Density for active streetscape to support local businesses and transit
- More housing options
- Health and well being of residents by encouraging walking, alternative modes of transportation
- Sense of place and community


Best Use

- Business zones not a good fit
  - BU 1, 2, 3 allow 2-4 stories, but taller more appropriate to incorporate features
  - BU4 allows 8 stories ~ too tall
- MU4 designed to better meet contemporary needs
  - Housing
  - Economic Development
  - Mixed Use
  - Lively streetscape
  - Sense of Place


# **Special Features**

- Five stories if housing is included
- Step back to allow light and reduce mass
- Ample changeable display windows
- Well-placed doors
- Compatible uses <5000 sf by right</li>
- Wider sidewalks
- Setbacks no more than 10' on street to create enclosure
- Beneficial open space
